

The 57th Detroit Autorama ISCA show at Cobo Hall in Detroit MI is over and the results are in. The new 2008 C6 Cauley Racing Corvette from D. J. Race Enterprise has taken the top honors in the Production Road Race Class. The Corvette was a fan favorite and drew lots of attention as part of a six car display for the Waterford Hills Road Race track.

Bob Larivee Jr., chief executive officer of Championship Auto Shows Inc. in Auburn Hills, which runs 18 auto shows around the country said attendance at the show is expected to top 100,000 and could be above average. Saturday's attendance was particularly strong, with an estimated 45,000 people showing up to view the customized hot rods, classic cars, and accessories.

"We talked to many fans of racing while down to Cobo for this 3-day event" said Danny Kellemeyer, builder and driver of the #37 C6 Corvette. "This is a true race car and right now we have tested at 3 tracks to shake down the new car for the 2009 racing season. This is definitely a good way to start the season off with a win at the largest hot rod show in the country".

This race car will see SCCA and WHRRI race events this season along with the other four cars from the DJ Racing stable. Jeff and Joe Cauley of West Bloomfield, MI and Robert and Jonathan Pfeffer of Avon, IN will drive those Cars.

Three other race cars from WHRRI took trophy honors, as did the display. The Waterford Hills Road Race display was awarded 2nd place in the club display category.
